#### The customer 'requirement':

- "I want one of those widgets" vs "What problem are you trying to solve?"
- 'Systems' approach
- What social and policy outcomes are sought?

'Functional' vs 'Technical' specifications:

- Roughly: 'What?' vs 'How?'
- Blurred boundaries between the two...
- Specification trade-offs: matters of judgment?

'Specification' vs 'The Market':

- Specifying a mobile phone...?
- Market maturity?
- Recent UK experience....

#### Specification pro's:

- Common starting point for Member States
- Knowing that what is procured, is what was required
- Assisting the market by specifying user needs
- Accountability to the taxpayer...

#### Specification con's:

- Do jurisdictions <u>really</u> know what they want?
- Likely to specify a product that doesn't exist...
- New product: high R&D cost, no guaranteed market
- Aggravated procurement bureaucracy
- More difficult for SME's...
- Commonality across jurisdictions??

#### EU-wide specifications, or not...:

- Limited operational requirement crossborder
- Operational benefits of inter-operability
- Opening up of EU-wide markets
- Potential stifling of local innovations
- Already a massive swathe of EU rules...

#### Concluding thoughts:

- Jurisdictions need to clarify policy intent
- Adoption of 'systems' approaches
- Understand existing markets
- Keep it simple
- Individual jurisdictions need to judge priorities and technical trade-offs
