






Number of foreign citizens in Norway per January 1






Percentage of foreign citizens Norway per January 1





Number of foreign citizens in Norway Per January 1, breakdown per area






The role of age categories








Percentage FNO in probation Norway, initiated activities

Number of FNO's in probation Norway, initiated activities, per area






Foreign offenders in probation

- Community sentence, Electronic Monitoring, Program for intoxicated drivers, Conditional release
- Survey among probation managers shows no specific actions or projects
- Main barrier is language, second is cultural difference and third is legitimacy
- See World Café report




Number FNP's Norway, per 15/11






Number FNP's new entries Norway, per 15/11






Foreign national prisoners per November 15






Origin Foreign National Prisoners per November 15

Main challenges

- Language !!
 - Very much variation in the use of interpreters
 - Budgets, technical equipment, when to use interpreter
- Criticism from National Ombudsman for Equality
 - Legislate on interpreting
 - Earmarked budgets at prison-level
- Cultural differences
- Legitimacy
- Trust in Correctional Service's employees



Policy at a national level

- Establishing a specialised prison for FNP's: Kongsvinger
- Gearing recruitment towards a majority FNP prison: Norgerhaven
- Organising courses in multicultural understanding and working with foreign nationals at University College KRUS
- Developing a handbook http://hdl.handle.net/11250/2358042
- Prioritising work with transfer of sentences



Specialised prison: Kongsvinger

- Transformed to prison for FNP's December 2012
- Close to Oslo city, removal center and airport
 - 92 closed capacity, 48 open
- Inmates to be transported out





Kongsvinger prison

Some numbers

Total 114 on 15 November 2016 = 81 % occupancy 9 % of all FNP's Why?

- Remands and transport
- Soon opening a ward for female FNP's
- 29 Poland
- 13 Albania
- 12 Lithuania
- 11 Romania
- 44 on remand = 39 %

Foreign national offenders in Norway



Advantages Kongsvinger

- Reduced isolation as a small group
- Developing specific activities
 - Concentrating competencies
- Developing policy and collaboration with relevant organisations
- More synchronised removal / extradition
- Close to Oslo airport



Kongsvinger prison

- Production work for general skills
- Collaboration with local school
 - Short courses, esp. after Norgerhaven
 - English, digital skills, vehicle driving, cooking, personal hygiene
 - All with a diploma

- Leisure time activities with professional guidance
 - Tuesday break for those who isolate themselves
 - Brochure: «What can I do alone in a cell»



Kongsvinger prison

- Much internal communication in order to «catch» as much information as possible
 - Most religious activity of all prisons
 - Long-distance on-screen interpreters
- Feelings and relationships more important than among other prisonsers
- Many with PTSD



Program «Planning for resettlement»

Foreign national offenders in Norway

- Developed in collaboration with inmates
- At least two weeks left of sentence
- Goal is to make FNP's better equipped for returning to the community – anywhere
- Groups of 3-4, but also individual if necessary
- Psycho-educative approach, motivational interviewing
- Little text, many illustrations



Program «Planning for resettlement»

8 Sessions:

- 1. Presentations and expectations
- 2. Goal setting
- 3. Life areas
- 4. Stages of change
- 5. There is a connection.... (thinking emotions
 - physical reactions behavior)
- 6. Risky thinking
- 7. Planning why and how
- 8. Finish plans and Tie everything together



Program «Planning for resettlement»

- Language and culture can be challenging
- Works with only few participants
- Treat just a few themes per meeting time is important for reaching understanding
- Stronger taboos
- Less narcotics
- More and different mental health problems
- Participants feel more «normal», say they learn to think differently



Majority FNP prison: Norgerhaven

- Located in The Netherlands
- Dutch staff, Norwegian management and regime
- Opened September 2015
- Only sentenced prisoners
- Last two months in Norway





Norgerhaven prison

Some numbers

Capacity of 242

Total 239 = 99 % occupancy

57 - Norway = 24 %

Less than 10 % entry ban

28 - Poland 20 - Albania 17 - Lithuania 22 - Romania



Advantages Norgerhaven

- Extended functioning for prison
- Jobs remain
- Reduce the pressure on the Norwegian system
- No time lost in building
- No remaining investment and overcapacity
- Motivated staff
- Opportunity to serve sentence asap
- For those with no immediate ties to Norway
- For many: closer to family
- Extras



Extras inmates Norgerhaven

- More, longer and flexible visiting hours; may be over more days
- + 3 x more telephone / Skype time per week
 - Facilities for training and yard time
 - Different work schedule with two shifts
- Dutch habits (food!)


