PRISON OVERCROWDING AND REDUCING CONGESTION

- > Prison overcrowding is a problem all over the world
- > Causes of overcrowding: high rates of pre-trial detention and over-use of imprisonment as the default setting of the penal system
- > Alternative sanctions:-
- Probation a sentence requiring supervision by a probation officer in the community
- Community service the offender is ordered to carry out a number of hours of unpaid work for the benefit of the community


Benefits of alternatives to prison

- > Prisons as school for crime
- > Without support people will continue to re-offend
- > Prisons are damaging for prisoners' mental and physical health
- > Impact on families with a parent in prison

Recommendations for action

- > Training new magistrates and judges
- > Identifying suitable candidates for alternatives
- > Improving implementation and enforcement of orders
- > Gaining public support



Probation and Community Service in East Africa

- > Kenya: Greatest use of alternative sentences and the best developed infrastructure. Between 2005 – 2010, 97% community service orders were completed successfully.
- > Uganda: Probation is only available for children but community service orders are available for adults.
- > Tanzania: Probation and community service orders are available on a similar model to Kenya (but fewer resources).
